
TIMELESS LUXURY ON THE HUDSON RIVER

The Stewart House is an idyllic waterfront escape with magnificent views of the Hudson River, a vibrant local culture, and modern hospitality. Steeped in history and located just two hours from New York City, guests have been warmly welcomed since 1883.

The Italianate-style boarding house turned boutique hotel was meticulously restored in 2018 with a fresh perspective, striking a balance between luxury and comfort. An Art Deco bar, farm-to-table tavern, and waterfront grill complement nine elegantly appointed guest rooms.

Framed by majestic willow trees, this architectural gem graces the riverfront in Athens, NY, a quaint valley town just minutes from Hudson and Catskill. Discover a haven of modern amenities and quiet charm in a setting that has anchored a local community for generations.





ROOMS & AMENITIES

Nine spacious guest rooms express a fusion of modern elegance and traditional comfort in their thoughtful design. Carefully selected antique pieces, color palettes and textiles compose a warm and indulgent setting against a monumental Hudson River backdrop. Guests are greeted each morning with a continental breakfast. Refreshments are always available in the cozy reading nook on the second floor, where a bounty of literature adorns the shelves.

EAT & DRINK

The beauty and bounty of the Hudson Valley shines through in the seasonal cuisine thoughtfully prepared by Executive Chef Bob Turner and his team. Favorite menu standards like 5th generation family secret Irish soda bread with house-made cultured butter appear alongside unique seasonal specialities that embrace local agriculture.



CA. 1883 TAVERN

Hand-painted murals and tin ceilings adorn the Art Deco bar and dining room. The decor is stunning, but the food steals the show. Farm-sourced dishes comprise an everevolving menu, while locally distilled spirits, craft beer, and delicious wine flows from the bar. A destination in the Hudson Valley for live, often local music, Thursday burger & beer specials, "Fish Frydays" and "Sunday Roasts".



THE RIVER GRILL

Waterfront dining on the banks of the Hudson River, under a canopy of colossal willow trees. Bright, fresh cocktails, local craft beer, and a curated wine list accompany famed single-flip Highland Hollow beef burgers and other wood-fired grill specialties. A dedicated dock welcomes boaters, and the Hudson-Athens Ferry runs on weekends in July & August for a fun adventure from neighboring Hudson. As day turns to night, live music invites you to pause in a setting that lets summer linger.

BOB TURNER, EXECUTIVE CHEF

Bob's philosophy is straightforward: Cook locally, seasonally, and simply. An honors graduate of the Culinary Institute of America, Bob continued his training at the Institute for Integrative Nutrition and Cornell University. His twenty years of food service experience includes Executive Chef roles at The Omega Institute in Rhinebeck, NY and Rivertown Lodge in Hudson. His holistic approach to food is focused on relationships. He believes a closer relationship with food, including knowing the farmers who grow it, is not only meditative, but also promotes conscious consumption that positively impacts other areas of life.

STEEPED IN HISTORY

Athens is a longstanding community along the Hudson River, first settled in 1706. Rich in history and natural beauty, much of its original architecture can still be admired today. Notable residences, storefronts and industrial buildings emerged as local industry thrived in the 19th century. Brickyards, ship builders, ice harvesters and potters contributed to the bustling economy.



In 1877, Athens was at the height of prosperity, when William and Ida Stewart purchased a plot on Water Street and began work on their new boarding house, which first welcomed guests in 1883. Simultaneously, the Stewarts started a family, having three children and tragically losing two of them at young ages. Their daughter, Harriet, or "Hattie", was raised alongside the growing business, becoming a keen business woman, and taking over operations as an adult.

Original documents Hattie left behind include payroll sheets, the tab log, and hotel reservation lists. The occasional diary entry, post card, or love letter reveal she was likely more interested in the success of her business than fulfilling a traditional domestic role. Some records suggest she eventually married an Abram Post, though no evidence of a marriage license has been found. She is revered as the earliest suffragette in Athens.



As Hattie's successful run came to an end, another young Athens couple took over. Bill & Marion Garbasz ushered in a new era for the property in 1949, reestablishing it as The Athens Hotel. Marion's cooking put it on the map as an outstanding dining destination, and it was a haven for club meetings, milestone events and celebrations. Locals hold fond memories of the Garbasz days, which came to an end in 1986.

RESTORATION & REVIVAL



After more than 100 years in business, the property closed to the public but remained in the spotlight. Movie buffs will recognize the building from the 1988 film Ironweed, based on William Kennedy's novel, starring Jack Nicolson and Meryl Streep. It can also be spotted in several scenes of Steven Spielberg's War of the Worlds in 2005.

The new millennium brought several rounds of ownership changes and re-openings before The Stewart House landed in the hands of Lon and Lois Ballinger in late 2017. Entrepreneurs by nature, the Ballingers were at the helm of iconic Webster Hall in New York's East Village for over thirty years. Lois recalls a love at first sight feeling on their first tour of the Athens property. She knew they could restore it to its full, gorgeous and lively potential. In May of 2018, The Stewart House reopened once again. This time, with a focus on elevated authentic style, subtle yet attentive hospitality, locally sourced food and quality live music. The rest is history in the making.





LOCATION

The great outdoors, wild adventure, historical landmarks, timeless architecture, stunning waterfalls, and artistic treasures have drawn visitors to the Hudson Valley and Catskill Mountains for nearly two centuries. A vibrant local agriculture and dining scene and communities rich in arts and entertainment, make it a destination now more than ever.

Greene County is home to one of two "forever wild" parks in the state, the highest peaks in the Catskills, and New York's highest cascading waterfall, Kaaterskill Falls.

Driving: less than 15 minutes from the NYS Thruway.


Hudson-Athens Ferry: runs
